DRAFT MINUTES OF COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY 19 NOVEMBER AT 7.30 PM

1. ATTENDED BY

2. <u>APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE</u>

Anthony Palmer (AP), Peter Barham (PB), Katie Winterstein (KW), Joanne Preston (JP), Andy Booth (AB) & James Walton(JW).

The minutes of the previous were approved.

It was noted that this meeting was not quorate so no formal decisions could be made.

3. MATTERS ARISING

MMM Payments –AB has explored the possibility of offering members a variety of alternative ways of making their subscription payments which were in line with options offered at many other clubs and gymnasiums. The committee would need to speak with Alex Preston to discuss transaction fees. The members present at the meeting felt that this was something that could be further explored when the meeting was quorate as it made the clubs fees more affordable particularly for families. MB thanked AB for the work, he had done on this. Action – to bring back the next committee meeting

Joint Tennis and Squash Membership – SM reported that he has spoken to the chairman of the tennis club who was keen to explore this further. Whilst this may not be of huge financial gain to the club it was a means of encouraging younger players to play squash and tennis, and it was hoped that this exposure could result in future players for both clubs. <u>Action</u> – SM to meet with chair of tennis club for explore all of the options.

Padel Court – the club still wishes to continue to explore the possibility of installing a padel court particularly with the potential new build being approved for Tring and the requirement of sporting facilities for the increase in population – ongoing

4. OFFICERS' REPORTS

<u>A – CHAIRMAN</u>

SKAmungas event was a success but MB reported that there was an issue with the EPOS system on the evening which resulted in the system being overloaded. This is being investigated to try to ensure this doesn't happen at the next event.

It was also reported that the club was left in a poor state the following day so additional cleaning is required for all large events - this is being investigated. Ticket prices for events should reflect the additional cleaning costs associated with holding large events.

When the stage is in place the exit sign on the doors to the garden are covered so an additional sign will be needed to direct people via the games room. <u>Action</u> – NK to investigate

The squash club annually puts an advertisement in the Pepper Magazine however the advert now looks very old and tired and needs to be more up to date to inspire people to take up squash. <u>Action</u> – to find a graphic designer within the club that might be able to help with the update (All)

Ladies changing rooms – new tiles have been chosen and club is chasing the builder to come and get them fitted. Whilst the black mats are making the area safe it would be nice to get the changing room finished – ongoing.

<u>B – TREASURER</u>

PB provided members with the Sept '24 quarter management accounts, Profit & Loss and Balance Sheet and the Profit & Loss a/c for the corresponding period Sept'23 (these have been circulated to all members.

The profit for the Sept quarter this year of £7,833 compares to £940 last year. The main reason for the £6,893 increase is:-

- £4k higher Bar sales (£18.7k vs £14.4k) and at a higher gross profit due to the bar price increases. (Both Subscription income of £8.2k and Court Booking income of £5.2k are comparable to last year)
- £2k lower costs (£18.0k vs £19.9k)
